



Market Art Fair announces participating galleries and shows the breadth of the Nordic art scene

Market Art Fair proudly announces the 38 selected galleries participating in this year's fair at Liljevalchs on April 29th to May 1st. The line-up once again features galleries from each of the Nordic countries, including long-time participants such as Swedish exhibitors **Galerie Nordenhake** and **Galleri Magnus Karlsson**. The fair welcomes the return of galleries including **i8** from Iceland, **Nils Stærk** and **Galleri Nicolai Wallner** from Denmark; alongside first time participants including **Issues** and **Galleri Glas** from Sweden, as well as the Swiss gallery, **Dierking - Galerie am Paradeplatz**.

The sixteenth edition of the Market Art Fair, led by Managing Director Sara Berner Bengtsson, presents a forward-looking fair with an ambitious and progressive line-up of internationally established artists, and support for younger galleries that represent a broad range of artistic expression. This year's edition of the fair includes Market Extended, an opportunity to experience large scale installations and sculptural works outdoors, sited at Liljevach's courtyard.

Highlights of this year's fair include presentations from the Nordic region's foremost artists including renowned Icelandic artists Ragnar Kjartansson, Arna Óttarsdóttir and Shoplifter (Hrafnhildur Arnardóttir); Galerie Nordenhake presents Petra Gipp and Mikael Olsson, whose acclaimed collaboration began in preparation for the Venice Architecture Biennale 2018; **Tal R** and **Jepp Hein**, from Denmark, both have concurrent solo



exhibitions in Stockholm museums during the fair – **Tal R** at Artipelag and **Jeppe Hein** at Moderna Museet. Visitors can also experience showcases from leading contemporary Swedish artists including **Mamma Andersson, Julia Bondesson, Theresa Traore Dahlberg, Åsa Jungnelius and Eva Måg.**

- We have had fantastic interest from galleries for this year's fair with tough competition to participate. Visitors will enjoy really strong presentations from celebrated artists, including several established artists currently exhibiting in Stockholm museums, as well as encountering the unexpected and discovering new names. Market Art Fair 2022 encompasses the breadth of the Nordic art scene; from Sami cultural identity to international galleries such as i8 and Galleri Nicolai Wallner.
